Garbage/Recycling/Yard Waste

The Borough offers residents free regular curbside garbage pickup. Garbage is collected twice a week from May 20 to September 14 and once a week the rest of the year. Residents interested in rear yard pickup for an annual fee should contact the hauler, <u>Suburban Disposal</u>, at 973-227-7020.

Recycling is collected every week. The material you set out at the curbside will alternate week to week. Commingled bottles and cans one week; newspapers and magazines the next and so on. Recycling is required by the law.

Curbside yard waste is collected between March and December. Grass, weeds, leaves, hedge trimmings, and tree prunings should be placed at the curb in containers no larger than 30 gallons or in biodegradable paper bags.
